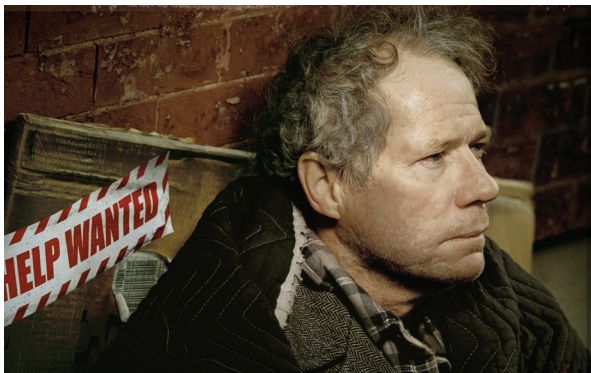

Through the dedication of 325 employees and a volunteer base of more than 850 community supporters, Volunteers of America Oregon helps thousands of children, adults and seniors each year through 30 social service programs.



## OVERVIEW OF PROGRAMS

We operate a comprehensive array of programs in four areas

### **PUBLIC SAFETY PROGRAMS:**

An opportunity to start over. Our Public Safety Programs help men and women leaving the justice system build lives free from addiction and foster the self-sufficiency to help them become productive members of our community.

### **CHILDREN, FAMILY, AND SENIORS:**

Healthy families mean healthy kids. Our services seek to prevent family violence and promote resiliency, helping vulnerable families overcome trauma and give their children and youth the best possible start in life. Compassionate care for the most important members of our families. Our Adult Day Centers offer therapeutic health and social day-time environments for elderly and disabled adults.

### **ADDICTIONS PREVENTION AND TREATMENT:**

Our comprehensive outpatient programs prevent and treat substance abuse, problem gambling, and mental health among youth and adults. Treatment is tailored to individual needs and includes individual and group counseling, naturopathic health care, medication management, and case management and referral services. Provide effective treatment, as opposed to costly incarceration, for low and medium risk offenders, we also offer culturally responsive services to the Latino and Asian communities.

### **BUSINESS ENTERPRISES:**

Retail, catering, and vehicle donation programs offer vital training and work experience opportunities for program participants as we help them change their lives. Proceeds from business enterprises directly fund our services.

## PUBLIC SAFETY PROGRAMS

**Addiction Recovery:** Resources to DHS Child Welfare referred parents that remove barriers to treatment, help parents move toward reunification with their children and create stable families.

**Community Monitoring Program:** CMP permits some at-risk youth who would otherwise be placed into detention to remain in the community under the supervision of Youth Monitors. CMP is a central component of Multnomah County's Juvenile Detention Reform Initiative.

**Day Treatment Services:** The Day Treatment Program helps chronically homeless men overcome addiction, rebuild their lives and become productive members of society.

**FIT (Family Involvement Team) for Recovery:** In collaboration with Multnomah County, six local alcohol and drug treatment agencies, and the Department of Human Services, FIT provides parents with addictions and Child Welfare involvement with rapid access to substance abuse treatment.

**Men's Residential Center:** A residential drug and alcohol treatment center for male offenders, this program includes four months of intensive treatment, two months of transitional care, and six months of continuing outpatient care. **Al Forthan Scholarship**—The scholarship honors Al Forthan, the first alumnus to become a counselor at the Men's Residential Center and is awarded to Oregon high school seniors whose families are affected by addiction and poverty.

**Sacramento Street Drug Free Recovery House:** Sacramento House is a clean, safe, rental home for six individuals in recovery from addiction who are re-entering productive society after completing residential treatment. The House is an alcohol and drug free group living environment.

**Training to Work Initiative:** In partnership with SE Works, we coordinate transitions from work release programs to longer term career path training and employment.

**VOA/Miracles Family Recovery Support:** Provides post-treatment services to families in recovery from addiction who have or have had child welfare involvement. Culturally-specific services provided to African American families.

**Women's Residential Center:** Female offenders in this residential drug and alcohol treatment program receive six months of intensive treatment and resources to address mental health, parenting, and abuse issues. The program allows young children to reside with their mothers while in treatment at the center.

## ADDICTIONS PREVENTION AND TREATMENT

**¡Adelante!** Culturally-specific addiction, problem gambling, medium risk treatment, and naturopathic health treatment to the Latino community. Bilingual and bicultural staff provide comprehensive services for individuals and families.

**Asian Services:** Culturally-responsive problem gambling addiction treatment specifically targeting the Asian community including individual, family, and group counseling, mental health treatment, financial planning, and budgeting.

**Co-located Addictions Screening and Treatment at Multnomah County Rockwood Health Clinic:** A partnership with Multnomah County, an InAct addictions treatment counselor collaborates with primary care physicians to treat patients with co-occurring health and substance abuse issues.

**Community Partners Reinvestment Project:** A collaborative that addresses the reintegration of young adult offenders (ages 18-25) from jail and prison back into society. Focus is placed on supporting a drug and crime-free healthy lifestyle and provide pre- and post-release counseling for both the young offender and his family.

**Homebase:** Intensive outpatient treatment with Drug-Free Housing. Outpatient treatment for 10 men in a monitored, clean and sober residential setting.

**Mentor Program:** Recovery mentors for men and women in treatment.

**Moving Forward:** A Justice Reinvestment program combines intensive treatment, wrap-around services, and mentors with community supervision as an alternative to costly prison sentences.

**Multnomah County START Court:** Addictions and mental health treatment for repeat property offenders.

**Multnomah County STOP Court:** Addiction mental health treatment, naturopathic healthcare, and parenting for individuals involved in the County Drug Court for drug-related offenses.

**Open Services:** Addiction and mental health treatment to the general public at InAct and Human Solutions sites.

**Problem Gambling Treatment:** Provides no-cost treatment for problem gamblers and their families.

**Re-entry Enhancement Coordination Program:** In partnership with community providers Bridges to Change and SE Works, REC provides intensive wrap-around services for men and women transitioning back to the community from prison.

**Youth Prevention Services:** Substance abuse and gambling prevention services at five Home Forward Public Housing sites to strengthen families by offering culturally-informed activities and support shaped by community input.

## CHILDREN AND FAMILY SERVICES

**CourtCare:** Certified drop-in childcare program at the Multnomah County Courthouse that protects children from traumatic court situations.

**Family Relief Nursery and Miracles Relief Nursery:** A child abuse & neglect prevention program that helps families reestablish safe, caring home environments. Culturally specific services to African American families.

**Home Free:** A comprehensive domestic violence intervention program that provides emergency, transitional, and advocacy services to over 5,000 adults and their children each year.

**My Little Waiting Room:** Certified drop-in childcare center at Providence St. Vincent Medical Center and Providence Portland for children while parents or guardians attend medical appointments or visit family members in the hospital.

## SENIORS SERVICES

**Adult Day Services:** Neighborhood-based centers provide a structured, comprehensive program designed to meet the needs of functionally and/or cognitively-impaired adults. Individually planned services, supervision, social and related support services, and health monitoring offered in a therapeutic setting.

**Whispering Pines Senior Village:** This 62-unit subsidized senior apartment community in Estacada, Oregon includes independent living units, community activities and amenities.

## BUSINESS ENTERPRISES

**Food Services:** Working with participants from the Women's Residential Center, Catering for a Cause is a leading catering service to the business community, providing over 300 meals per day.

**Vehicle Donations:** Accepts donated vehicles of all types which are sold to support our social service programs. The program also manages Charity Connection, a partnership with numerous local non-profits that facilitates vehicle donations for individual organizations, ensuring that 100% of the vehicle donation proceeds goes to charity.
